

Noisy Kids Reading Club Teacher Job Description - 2017

1) General description

- creating an environment which inspires confidence to try in your students.
- borrow resources from The Literacy Connection and/ or library to help teach literacy skills.
- work closely with volunteer(s) to provide one-on-one practice for reading with appropriate leveled books.
- maintain open communication with staff at your target school, administrator, volunteers and parents.
- On the final day of term, your students will perform their script for their families.
- use assessment tools provided to assess student progress.
- keep attendance records for students and volunteers.
- buy healthy snacks based on the allowed budget, keep receipts and submit these for reimbursement.
- complete a weekly time sheet. Weekly, you will submit student attendance, volunteer hours and your time sheet. Monthly, one will complete the snack reimbursement form and submit receipts.
- promote engagement in literacy (reading and writing), set attainable objectives for students to encourage success and self-confidence

2) Core activities

- Learning through games means that you need to use group, partner and individual games.
- outdoor play (imperative for children with attention disorders after a school day),
- interactive games that are directed at language learning (spelling, writing, reading out loud, vocabulary expansion, etc),
- projects to create pride in completion and to share with their family (activity sheets, art projects that involve words (ex. jewelry making with letter beads),
- book report, writing a story that they share with family and friends at end-of-year get together
- pairing students up in small groups with volunteers to participate in more intimate experience of reading with others.
